BOSTON, MA - The New York Rowing Association rowing team took 5 athletes to Boston this past weekend to compete in the 42nd Head of the Charles Regatta - the largest two-day sporting event in the world.

Competing alongside nearly 8,000 other athletes from around the world, and in front of an estimated 324,000 spectators, the NYRA boys posted a solid performances in the Boys Youth 4+ events.

The NYRA 4+ posted a time of 19:03 over the 3-mile Charles River course. That time was good for 27th overall and 21rd among the High School teams that participated. The NYRA managed to finish just ahead of Peddie school ,Deerfield Academy and Brewster Academy but slightly behind local rival Chaminade High School.

Head Coach Curry was pleased with the effort and the progress of the heavyweight shell.
